The meeting will take place at The Cotswold School, The Avenue, Bourton-on-the-Water. It will be signposted as you enter the village and when reaching the school all Morgan Three-Wheelers both driven or trailered will be directed to a dedicated parking area. All other vehicles will be directed to the main car park. Please follow the marshals instructions on arrival, to ensure an orderly event.

The gates will open at 1030hrs, a comfortable indoor seating area and refreshments are available on site on your arrival.

The event has been organised at the school with a view to engaging teenagers to our particular early form of transport.

In addition to our cars there will also be some early Light Car/Cyclecars on display both at the school and at the Cotswold Motor Museum which is but a short walk away. The museum in itself is well worth a visit and a reduced entry price is available on the day. In addition to the above Michael Joseph has agreed to bring along his Green Power car to demonstrate to school pupils and anyone interested. So it is expected to have some of the earliest and future forms of transport on display.
